



See differently

These tips should be used when using a wheelchair consider social distancing guidelines and guidance on reducing the risk of spreading the virus.

- Everyone's sight loss experience is different. Some people will require more support than others.
- Introduce yourself, what you do and ask them what assistance they may require.
- If supporting someone to a wheelchair, show them its dimensions by placing their hand on the back, base and arms. Then allow them to sit independently.
- Point out consistent areas throughout the guiding journey, allowing the person to build up a mental picture of their surroundings.
- Advise when turning, by saying left turn or right turn. This can be reinforced by tapping the corresponding shoulder.
- Advise if using a lift or ramp and say if going up or down.
- Warn the person when going backwards. Only move backwards when necessary e.g. being guided down a ramp or kerb.
- Let the person know when they have reached their destination and if you have applied the brakes.
